

MORRIS WINCHEVSKY SCHOOL: Toronto's Secular Jewish Community School 2011-2012 Academic Year

Modules: For students in Grades 1-6, this flexible program offers a series of thematic modules. Families can choose to enroll for any or all modules. Modules run for a period of 6 weeks; two modules are offered during each 6-week session. Registration for any module includes registration for the core program during that 6-week session.

Core Program: The modules are complemented by a compulsory core program, which covers Jewish holidays, traditions, languages, life cycles, values and ethics.

MODULES #5 & #6 - January 8 - February 12, 2012

#5 A Jewish Music Journey through the Ages:

Proudly offered in partnership with Ashkenaz Foundation's 'Ashkenaz in the Schools' program*

What are different forms of music from Jews around the world? Learn songs in a variety of Jewish languages, learn about how Jews have valued music through the ages, and learn about how our community sings together to grow together. Our journey will include Cantorial, Sephardic/Mizrachi, Ladino, Klezmer, Yiddish and Israeli music. Guest facilitators include Aaron Bensoussan, Aviva Chernick, Mitch Smolkin, Eric Stein and Avital Zemer.

#6 Eco-Jews: Culture, Environment, Activism:

From *Tu B'shvat* – the festival of the trees to Jewish teaching gardens, Jews celebrate the natural world. Find out what is Jewish about environmental action. We will also embark on projects that educate and inspire environmental change through a variety of activities.

MODULES #7 & #8 - February 26 – April 29, 2012

#7 Secular and Jewish? Who, What, Why?:

Humanistic Jews believe that it is our community and culture that make us proud to be part of Jewish life. Find out about the history of our movement. Join activities that highlight cultural Judaism and how special it is. These include "*tikkun olam*" (repairing the world), social justice, the bible as literature (bible stories and more), holidays and practices that enrich us, and much more.

#8 Anti-Semitism and Resistance through the Ages:

The common joke about Jewish holidays is: “they tried to harm us, we triumphed, let’s eat!” Find out more about the struggles Jewish communities have faced, and how we have fought against them. These will include stories which are loosely based in history such as Purim, Chanukah and Passover, as well as historical struggles such as the Spanish Inquisition, the European Pogroms, the ghettos of the Second World War, and more. Find out this part of our history and how we use our experience of anti-Semitism in our efforts to end racism and injustice in other communities as well.
