RECAP: The First Bagel Brunch

We invited Regional Councillor Paul Palleschi, the elected official representing Camp Naivelt (Wards 2 and 6 in Brampton) to join us. He is very qualified, as his duties include acting as Chair of the Planning, Design and Development Committee, and a member of the Growth Management Steering Committee and the Transportation and Transit Master Plan Committee.

Here is a brief summary of what we heard:

GROWTH AND CONSERVATION ALL AROUND US:

Generally, he stated that because Brampton is a designated urban growth centre in the Provincial legislation, development will take place throughout Brampton's boundaries, with the exception of valley lands and flood plains. Flood plain protection is key to their plan, and they are working with Toronto Region Conservation Authority. Tree stands are also protected. However, development will occur in our "neighbourhood", and in fact, Kaneff Golf Course has recently submitted an application to develop part of its site into residential. He assured us that a "buffer" of at least 10 metres will be created between any new development and Naivelt. There is a small greenbelt within the City limits, along Heritage Rd. however, pretty much all of Brampton is going to be developed to keep up with its huge predicted population increase.

GETTING AROUND:

Churchville Road is going to remain designated a "rural road", and will not be widened nor will there be any transit service added. The new James Potter Road just to the east will be the major thoroughfare, and will eventually carry transit. Additional higher-order transit (i.e. dedicated ZUM bus lane, LRT) will be added along Queen St. and Steeles. Their ZUM line has been incredibly successful, both financially and in terms of increased usage. They are breaking Canadian records on both fronts.

IMPROVING PARK INFRASTRUCTURE:

There are a number of new 40-acre parks planned for Brampton, and many of the larger new developments include the addition of community parks. Some will have aquatic facilities, but there are no outdoor pools planned. He said "Cities are getting out of the outdoor pool business", as they are seasonal, costly to run and maintain. He said he fought to keep our pool open.

There was a lively discussion and Q&A following his presentation, where many Naivelters asked questions and made suggestions about items such as safety at specific intersections, the management of access and parking during large corporate events in Eldorado Park, and proper protection from golf balls. He suggested we flag specific issues directly with his office. He stated that he is retiring at the end of this year, and his son will be running for office.
