

“So what if nothing is revealed. Todd Haynes is a mischievous visionary who puts the music and the myth of Bob Dylan before us in *I'm Not There* and dares us not to revel in the troubadour's poetic, contentious, ever-changing essence. It's a feast for the eyes, the ears and the Dylanologist scratching around our minds and hearts. And, get this, never once does Haynes mention the name of the mesmeric changeling at his film's center. There's no need: Cover versions of Dylan songs occupy the movie like angels and demons doing battle at an exorcism. Not content with just one actor to portray Dylan in the act of inventing and reinventing himself, Haynes hired six and hit the jackpot with Cate Blanchett. She burns through Haynes' head-trip odyssey like an illuminating torch. Blanchett's soon-to-be-legendary performance is not a stunt, it's some kind of miracle. Playing the skinny, androgynous Dylan in his electric years — when his hair stood on end to match his fried nerves — Blanchett extends the possibilities of acting. You won't see a better example of interpretive art this year by man or woman.”

Digging into Camp Naivelt's Archaeological Past with David Lipovitch



Despite what many people think, the area near Brampton has been occupied for nearly 12,000 years, beginning with the Paleo-Indians who settled there at the end of the last Ice Age. The area around the Credit River is rich in natural resources and was an area of prime real estate both prehistorically and historically. Dr. Lipovitch will present an overview of the 12,000 year long prehistory and history of the region around Camp Naivelt highlighting the archaeological potential of the area.



David Lipovitch is a professional archaeologist with years of field experience in southern Ontario, Israel, and Turkey. His doctoral dissertation at Harvard University was entitled *Can These Bones Live Again: An Analysis of the Non-Canid Mammalian Faunal Remains from the Achaemenid period at Tel Ashkelon, Israel*. He is currently a Research Associate at the University of Toronto and the zooarchaeologist for the Ta'yinat Archaeological Project. He is also the Education Director of Toronto's Secular Jewish Community School, a new division of the Morris Winchevsky School.
