WELCOME!

WiFi Wonderful

Hill 1's WiFi is working fine, as it has in the last few years (thanks Gord). The Hill 1 network has a password, **oyvey**, all lower case. There is no password on Hills 2 and 3.

After some ups and downs, Hill 3 seems to be fairly reliable now. The signal covers most of the hill, greatly expanded from last year's experiment. I know the signal strength at the foot (hollow, lower numbers, whatever one calls it) is weak, but I hope to improve that in the next couple of weeks. In the meantime, moving a few feet one way or the other can often make a difference.

Hill 2 has had an ongoing problem that I have been unable to find the cause of. The problem is that after a time the router (wireless portion) loses its connection with the modem (the box that gets the internet from the phone line). The symptom that users see is that although there is the Hill 2 wireless network available, one is not able to connect to the internet and you get a network error message.

My brute force solution is to have the hardware power down and back up every three hours, at 7, 10, 1, 4 etc. That means at those times the wireless signal will disappear for a minute or two, and it will be another minute or two after that until the internet connection is made. In that minute or two after the signal reappears and before the internet connection is made, you may get that error message. Try again in another minute.

On some more interesting notes, I am amused and delighted that the power for the hardware on Hill 2's pole in the circle is supplied by what probably would have powered the light in the phone booth many years ago. And so telecommunications evolve. On the environmental front, the waterproof boxes that house the gear are reused. The boxes previously housed voltage control electronics between solar panels and the battery storage (must have been some early stuff to be end-of-life already).

Some Reminders from the Camp Committee

Visitors to Camp

a) If you meet someone you don't know, be polite and ASSUME they are a legitimate visitor. A good opening line is, "Hello, how are you, who are you visiting – (ask for name, hill # and cottage #)". If they are "up the hill", by mistake, politely indicate "this is private property, maybe you missed seeing the "private property" and "no trespassing" signs, I'll have to ask you to leave – thanks." If they are particularly interested in camp, you can indicate where they can get more information on the internet or give them the number of the office.

b) Cottage owners must notify the Winchevsky Centre office (416-789-5502) should they have anyone other than themselves stay in their cottage for more than a day. Such newcomers/visitors to Camp would be welcomed and listed in weekly Naivelt News.

c) If you are renting or loaning your cabin to anyone for more than 3 weeks they **must** fill in an application form, which can be obtained from the Office, indicating they have read and will abide by Camp Naivelt Regulations. Newcomers/visitors to Camp will be welcomed and listed in our weekly Naivelt News.

d) The Naivelt gate must be kept locked at all times unless a sign is put on for visitors and then locked when all guests have arrived/left.

Eldorado Park

a) Parking / access – Ask park staff to help find drivers who are blocking our access. If necessary call Brampton police re: ticketing of cars parked illegally.

Noise in Park - Politely ask people to turn down music. A full update on discussions with the park will be presented at the 1st Bagel Brunch.

b) Garbage and recycling – Drop off in bins beside Kevin's (on your right when you first enter the park). Please do not put large pieces of furniture in these bins. If necessary, drop those off on the north side of the Hill 1 entrance and call the City of Brampton for pick up.

c) New Pool Hours: 2–6 pm to the public but 1:00 pm for Naivelters taking part in Aquafit. Season swim passes will be available for Naivelters.

Public/Private Space

a) There is now parking at the end of Hill 3.

b) The beginning of Hill 3 at the gully area with cedars and removable barrier is now a safe spot for young children to play. All are welcome to use this area. See previous e-mail.

c) Please clear up junk/building materials/brush around your cabin

d) Remember to drive slowly in camp (10km/hr. max.)

e) New washing machine at the Ritz, details at Bagel Brunch

f) The fire pit will be supervised to ensure adult lighting of fires, no sticks for play, shoes at all times and the requirement for water – bonfires posted in Naivelt News.

g) UJPO membership is required and must be maintained in good standing in order to own a cottage. Transfers or sales of private cottages must be done through the UJPO office. The Camp Committee facilitates this process.
