

GATE ETIQUETTE

The gate must be closed whenever you leave Camp, even to dash to the garbage bin or to visit someone on one of the Hills for only a couple of minutes. When the gate is left open, it is an invitation to any park visitor to innocently wander into Camp. More than a few times, these innocent visitors have found themselves locked in with no way to get their automobile back into the park lands without searching for someone with a key. This situation is a big hassle for everyone, except the person who left the gate open. If you are going down to the garbage bin, close the gate!

If you are having a number of guests arriving and leaving throughout the day, or you're expecting a repair person to arrive, leave the gate unlocked, but closed. The lock can be attached to the chain so that it appears to be locked, but isn't. It is important to attach a note to the gate with your

name, cottage number and the start and end time for the gate to be left unlocked. When your guest or repair person arrives, they can leave the gate the same way they found it so they are able to leave without you making a trip to the gate. The visitors must understand that they must lock the gate when they leave. If your guests / repair person leaves after 9 PM, you should go down with them to ensure that they can get through the park gate at Creditview Road. The park is officially closed - the front gate locked - at 9 PM. Departures after 9 PM can leave a visitor locked between the front gate and the Naivelt gate. When this happens, your company must park outside of the Naivelt gate and walk up to get you to let them out. We all know that sometimes the park gate is left open until almost 10 PM. It is risky to assume, however, that the gate is open after 9 PM. Happy gate-keeping!

Harebell (*Campanula rotundifolia*)

There are more than 30 named wild varieties of *Campanula rotundifolia*. This plant which may be found in Naivelt's grounds is also known as Goblin's, witches' or Puck's thimble. Harebell leaves can be eaten raw in a salad and the plant is known to have beneficial properties. These include a remedy for earache that can be made from the roots and a wash for the treatment of sore eyes. Other conditions Harebell is said to cure include depression and if the root is chewed, it may help to treat heart and lung complaints. As always though, consult a professional before attempting any GG remedies!
