## The Appy Camper

At last week's Bagel Brunch, Alan Cantor mentioned his metronome app and now we have more details for all you musicians out there.

**BeMetronome:** a virtual metronome for Android devices. It is reliable, precise, and easy to use. Its features include:

- Free! — no ads, fees, paid features, or spam.
- Set tempo to 20 to 900 beats per minute (bpm)
- Choose your own tempo buttons
- Fine-tune tempos in 0.1 bpm intervals
- Swipe left and right to change tempo by 1 bpm; swipe up/down to change tempo 0.1 bps
- Tap with average tempo
- Can play random tempos within a range

Thanks, Alan. It's great to get the scoop on what works. There are other similar free programs to try, whether you have Android or Apple.

P.S. - Last week I forgot to mention the flashlight feature uses a lot of your charge, so remember to turn it off. Most of us learn this the hard way. HK
